### 10-Minute Speaker - John Redward

Our cameo speaker was John Redward who shared his experience as an Honorary Matai to a particular village in Samoa. This honour was bestowed on him because his son married a Samoan lady who was a Princess of her village, and her husband must have a suitable level of importance according to their culture. Since John as his father is still alive, the title will reside with John until he dies, at which point it will be inherited by his son.

John showed us the lei he was given, a wreath made from seeds of the pandanus tree which is indigenous to that area, and painted a glossy red, an orator's stick, an imposing and heavily carved long walking-type stick which affords him the right to speak at meetings, and a swishy horse's tail affair which he wields with amazing aplomb, he thinks it is keep off predatory females. It has given him real insight into the very different culture of the islands and he really loved the singing at the services he attended during his installation. I would shout out a



special thanks to John for coming to do his talk because he had a family health emergency in Auckland and was going there as soon as he had finished with the meeting.

### Guest Speaker: Linda Niccol writer and Director of the Film "Poppy"

Our main speaker today was Linda Niccol, a Kapiti local who was the writer and director of the film Poppy, about a young woman with Down's Syndrome who was seeking to lead a full life. It was fascinating to hear how long the whole process took. Linda is a writer and has written and published books and collections of short stories, and in fact the basis of the film Poppy was one





The film was with funding from the New Zealand Film Commission, by way of a very competitive bid process. I was surprised to learn that the money is in fact a loan which must be repaid if and when the movie makes any money. They also had a generous private donation from the mother of a child with Down's Syndrome, which enabled them to proceed on the basis of a total of \$1.7 million. This enabled the movie to get off the ground. It sounds like a lot of money until you realise the specialist skills involved in the production of a movie and the cost of hiring the necessary skills, getting venues, services, transport etc. Linda said that a lot of the people were generous in providing sites for filming, and

mentioned the former bowling alley up here at Lindale. She sourced all the music from New Zealand bands and was able to secure use of music at reasonable cost. One of the actors in

the film wrote all the songs he sang and the score was done by four local composers. She mentioned the special skill in scheduling of John from Paekākāriki who ensured they came in under budget, a major feat. Their last week of filming was closed down due to the first Covid shut down and was delayed for some months. Challenging.

The young star, Libby, was apparently really amazing and a natural dancer who made it unnecessary to have a choreographer. She was chosen from 22 applicants and was very confident, with some drama and dance experience. She had to have a coach with her to ensure she was at ease and peak energy to perform. She had weeks of tutoring in a garage to make her familiar with cars and repairs and handling things to be convincing as an apprentice mechanic. Libby turned 18 during the course of the filming.

In answer to questions, Linda advised that she earned the equivalent of an annual salary for directing, around \$ 60 or 70,000 and a fee for the writing. This was for the period of producing the movie and the



almost a year to do post production. So, this is not the road to riches, unless you're directing Superman or the Marvel franchises which have budgets of many millions of dollars. There are no residual fees and all the awards the film has won produce trophies, not money, and you pay your own way to get to them. This is obviously a passion and a labour of love. The movie is available to see free on TVNZ+ if you'd like to have a look.

Linda provided a really interesting glimpse into a world that is foreign to most of us. Her movie has won awards at overseas film festivals in the US (New York and Palm Springs), Ireland, France and even made it to Finland. – Pat Humphries.
