#### 10-Minute Speaker - Dr. Ken Milne



Our cameo speaker was Ken Milne, who, it turns out, has a PhD and is an expert on viruses which attack cantaloupes and other melons.... who knew? He is now Emeritus Professor at Massey University (which he says his wife claims just means he is an old professor) having had a distinguished 38-year career as an agricultural scientist at Massey. He won a scholarship which took him to the University of California at Davis, which is near Sacramento, to do his doctorate.

He came back to New Zealand and established his academic career. He also turned down a very lucrative offer from James Wattie to set up a research facility in Hawkes Bay to oversee and monitor the fruit and vegetables Wattie's grew there. He has enjoyed a long and illustrious career including serving on national and international boards which audit university processes and performance.

It is always fascinating to learn of the wide range of skills and interests held by our membership. We are interested in everyone's story and would love to hear yours in one of our cameo talks. Do think about it and let James Abernathy know.


#### Guest Speaker: Sir Hugh Rennie, KNZM CBE KC.

Our main speaker was Sir Hugh Rennie, retired King's Counsel, who has enjoyed a long career as a lawyer in Wellington. Sir Hugh spoke of the Chatham Islands, past, present and future.

Found by accident by HMS Chatham which was lost in the 18th century, it was settled first by Morori and then Māori, escaping the Taranaki wars. It was fascinating and also irritating, a tale of a small settlement (currently between 600 and 1000 people) which has been in existence since around 1830 and treated with benign neglect by New Zealand governments for most of that time.

Successive governments put it in the too hard basket, and that's when they actually paid attention to it. It's only in the last 30 years that its actually been subject to New Zealand law. It didn't have a road until after the second world war. People were forced to use surf boats to land materials coming to the islands.

Councils were established but without money for infrastructure or expertise to operate. Transportation systems which were formulated by people whose ignorance of the practicalities of



operating there was woeful. They failed. Through stellar work by locals, a grant by government in 1995, and a few interested people, they have forged a successful tourism destination totally in the control of the locals, successful fishing, meat processing and some smaller businesses set up by returning young people who've had education off island and returned.

We should watch what happens here, as much success has been achieved since the locals were given a bit of money and some autonomy over 25 years ago and they've made a go of it. This a unique place with its own special culture where people are used to hardship and living with the vagaries of nature and way of life totally foreign to most of us. Thanks to Sir Hugh for the insights.




