10-Minute Speaker - Update of the Club's Constitution and Standing Resolutions



Our ten-minute speaker was Chris Harwood who brought us up to date with the changes to our Constitution and Standard Regulations, which have been revised in accordance with guidance from Probus South Pacific Ltd. (PSPL) so that our club will be compliant with new legislation.

All of the material has been provided by email, and we must vote on their adoption next month at a special general meeting which will be part of our November meeting so that we can meet the deadline required. Do please take part in this important process.

Guest Speaker: Richard Chapman, Education Officer at Government House

Our speaker was Richard Chapman, an educator at Government House. He chose to talk about the evolving role of the Governor General over the history of New Zealand. There have apparently been 38

since 1840 with the title being Governor until the early 1900s.

The first New Zealand born Governor General was Porritt, and apparently his daughter Joanne was renowned for being very attractive. She disappointed many of the locals by marrying one of the Aides de Camp at Government House.

It was interesting to learn of the different characters, like Lord Grey, who actually served two terms, which is no longer permitted. He was apparently largely responsible for the formulation of our constitutional arrangements and processes which set up governance in New Zealand, though neither popular nor a pleasing personality. There were time extensions for those Governors General who served during the First and Second World Wars.



The first appointee to be seen as a man of the people was Lieutenant General Bernard Freyberg, 1st Baron Freyberg, VC, GCMG, KCB, KBE, DSO and three bars, KStJ, who was British born but had in fact commanded New Zealand troops in WWII. He had an outstanding military career and served with distinction as Governor General. He was in office from 1946 until 1952.

Richard strongly encouraged a visit to Government House in Wellington, but also told of the glorious gardens at Government House in Auckland which he recommended for a visit. It was interesting to follow the progression of office holders moving from being appointees and aristocrats from the United Kingdom to being New Zealanders appointed by New Zealand Parliamentarians of the government and opposition, and of course the appointment of women to the role. But that's probably a whole different story – Pat Humphries




