10-Minute Speaker – Tim Allsop

Tim gave a very interesting talk about his wood-turning hobby. Tim told how he had done a course in woodworking and turning after he retired. It became a passion and it is expensive to setup the machinery needed, but he enjoys making beautiful things.

He sells a lot of what he makes but he told us says there is little money to be made if you consider the time and endeavour and the cost of materials. He likes to use a variety of decorative items like shells and tile work with the wood and, with a wife who is an artist, there is no shortage of inspiration. He brought a selection of beautiful items to let us see and he doesn't just turn bowls and plates and vases, but combines different woods and develops lattice like



patterns with colour variations which are beautiful and unusual. He will be exhibiting in The Kapiti Arts Trail at St Stephens Church on the corner of Langdale Avenue on 1-2 & 8-9 November 2025.

Guest Speaker: Graeme Jupp - 100th anniversary of the Titanic sinking



Our speaker Graeme Jupp gave a comprehensive address on his trip in 2012 to commemorate the Centenary of the sinking of the Titanic. He joined a cruise which travelled from New York up the east coast of the United States and Canada to Halifax in Nova Scotia where most of the bodies recovered from the tragedy were transported to. The ship anchored in the North Atlantic at the point where the Titanic went down and a live band played at the exact time, 1.40 am. He continued on then to the UK and Ireland.

Graeme's extensive collection of photos of the ship, the destinations, the memorials, and objects and facsimiles available to inspect in New York, Halifax, Cobh, Southampton, London, Liverpool and Belfast give a real graphic record. His specialised knowledge just rolls out with the photos in a way which is interesting and informative. He met with the descendants of some survivors, with renowned expert artists and writers who

have specialised in this field and

who gave lectures which provided insights into the effect of this tragedy. He talked about the ships and people involved in the rescue.

In the questions following the presentation, Graeme said so many of the people were unable to be identified because at that time people did not need the kind of documentation now required to travel internationally. There were many families caught up in this tragedy, which included the ship's crew, engineers, the musicians, the officers, the passengers who were part of the greatest maritime



tragedy which accounted for the loss of 1496 lives. I did not know how large a role was played by Halifax in Nova Scotia. – Pat Humphries.

Bus Trip to Woodville

On Thursday 11 September a group of 45 members and their partners embarked on a bus trip to Woodville via the new road - Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway.



It started off as a beautiful morning and we all thoroughly enjoyed the trip. We stopped for a while in Shannon to enable a visit to the conveniences and coffee for anyone who wanted to frequent the local cafés.

Unfortunately, Ruthann Doyle, suffered a medical event and an ambulance was called. She was taken to Palmerston North Hospital where she was kept under observation for a couple of hours and then taken home by an obliging neighbour who came to collect her. We are pleased to let you know that, following an adjustment to her medication, she is feeling much better. She has asked us to say thank you to everyone who helped her out during this time.

By the time we reached the beginning of the new road the clouds had rolled in, but we were very interested in what Wayne Stewart, a senior civil engineer who worked on the project, had to say. There is a parking area at the beginning of the road, with information on the project and an excellent view of the Parahaki Bridge. There are bike and walking trails being created along the Manawatu Gorge.





Wayne explained that the road is an 11.5 km, four-lane new highway between Ashhurst and Woodville. It replaces the old State Highway 3 after it was closed in 2017 due to landslides in the Manawatū Gorge.

I think we were all surprised to learn that the whole journey from one end to the other takes only about 11 minutes. It is, however, a very spectacular journey with long bridges, steep gradients, managed wetland and runoff areas together with panoramic views and stopping places to







enable vehicles to safely pull over and admire the scenery. There is a walking and cycling track which follows the road. Wayne recommended using an electric bike as the gradients are so long and steep! I did not hear if anyone was keen to give it a go, but it would make a very interesting 10-minute talk once the member had got their breath back!

On the other side of the hill, we made our way to the former Tui Brewery at Mangatainoka, where we partook of an excellent lunch, joined by Wayne who seemed to enjoy being

kidnapped by us, as he had not arranged transport back over the hill. As you can see, they laid on a wonderful spread for us. There was so much that many of us were able to take home some of the "leftovers".

There is an interesting museum area, recording the history of the brewery, which ceased brewing on site in 2015. They still have an active pub and conference centre with an outdoor area which would be lovely in warmer weather.



After lunch we stopped in Woodville for 45 minutes to allow everyone to wander around the town and check out the antique shops and other stores. This was marred a little by a short sharp shower, but most of us managed to stay under cover and stretch our legs, though I didn't notice any antiques making their way onto the bus. (Perhaps I should re-word that sentence!)

We then returned over the hill and dropped Wayne back off at the carpark with thanks and expressions of good will on all sides.

The journey home was enlivened by a series of jokes and sayings, circulated throughout the coach, to which we were apparently indebted to a member of the Bridge Club. A selection of candies also came our way and I for one enjoyed the chance to eat a jelly gecko (at least I hope it was a jelly gecko) and a variety of other sweets.

Finally, thank you very much to **John and Lesley Miller** for taking so much trouble to arrange such a fantastic day out. Your attention to detail is great and everyone really enjoyed themselves. – Linda Hall





We can hope for more settled weather for the walk for next month.


