## GOING PLACES (update from the Outings Desk)

LITTLE ITALY FOOD TOUR, FIVE DOCK & SYDNEY FISH MARKETS Tuesday, 5 August 2025



#### SOLD OUT - waitlist only.

Discover the delicious flavours of Sydney's Little Italy in an immersive food tour. This culinary adventure will showcase the vibrant local community of Five Dock and its delectable offerings.

Following the tour we will travel to the Sydney Fish Markets on Blackwattle Bay where we will have time to explore as well as on opportunity to buy fresh seafood to take home – eskies and ice will be provided for individual purchases.

**Note:** This tour is walker-friendly. We cover approximately 1km but the route is mostly flat, with occasional steps and a small incline up Great North Road. The total walking time is approximately 25-30 minutes, but with plenty of stops along the way.

Maximum 25 people for this tour. Cost is \$122 pp which includes: guided food tour including food samples from 3-4 venues and luxury coach transportation. Departs from Mona Vale Beach at 9:00 am and returns at approx. 5:00 pm.

# HIGH TEA AT THE VINTAGE SECRET GARDEN GALSTON

Tuesday, 2 September 2025



Our first stop on this tour will be morning tea at Fagan Park, with beautifully manicured gardens and 55 hectares of rolling green space. We will have free time to explore the Gardens of Many Nations, covering 10 hectares with 11 stunning themed gardens including Japanese, Dutch, Chinese and Mediterranean. The park was originally owned by the Fagan family and operated as an orchard and cattle farm before it was donated to the government. Netherby Cottage, which was the original Fagan family homestead, is still preserved on-site.

We will then escape to the Vintage Secret Garden, Galston where we will hear birds chirping and the calming sounds of the water fountain in a unique setting at this cute café. Our High Tea will consist of a beautiful three-tiered stand, featuring a mouth-watering selection of sweet delicacies, all baked onsite. Our high tea also includes delicious scones, savoury items and, of course, finger sandwiches. Beverages include a glass of sparkling wine on arrival as well as sparkling water and your choice of loose leaf tea, iced tea or a glass of juice.

**Cost is \$110** pp which includes: morning tea, High Tea lunch, including a glass of sparkling wine, and luxury coach transportation. **Departs from Mona Vale Beach at 8:30 am and returns at approx. 4:30 pm.**
