Guest speaker this month will be Margaret Haynes, whose presentation is titled "Meteorites - a Gift from the Gods". Margaret will examine how it is that Pharoah Tutankhamun was clutching his favourite dagger in his mummified hand and how it was that the dagger was made of stainless steel at a time when the ancient world had not mastered the making of iron and would not do so for 500 years! If you would like to hold an object older than the Earth itself, you are invited to this talk. Margaret will briefly discuss the Egyptian Gods, and why they gave helpful gifts to their believers, while in other cultures this did not occur. This is Margaret's first Probus talk and she is eager to share her knowledge with you! Margaret loves science in all its forms, whether geology, chemistry, archaeology, or (almost) any field of study. She is a "chemistry friend" of Georgia Deretic, who is a member of our Probus club – they taught together at the University of Sydney for many years.
