'Historic Buildings on North Terrace'

It was interesting to hear of some of the first buildings – tents for the first settlers, a 'shack' for Colonel William Light, an abattoir (now the site of the SAHMRI building), a pub across the road, the railway station, Parliament House, Government House and some of the University buildings.

David mentioned that he attended the University of Adelaide studying history, geography and music.
