#### **Guest Speaker: Lesley McCauley**

Lesley gave us an extremely interesting talk on some well-known Nursery Rhymes giving an insight into the numerous social, political and historical issues that are possibly behind the meaning of these rhymes. Some meanings have changed/evolved over time.

Members were able to sing along with Lesley, and proved we still remember the words.

Lesley began with Baa Baa Black Sheep; (possibly the oldest Nursery Rhyme - 1744), with the words set to a French tune. Followed by The Grand Old Duke of York, Happy Birthday To You (1875), which according to the Guinness Book of Records tops the list of most-sung songs across the world, Hickory Dickory Dock (1743), Humpty Dumpty (1803), The Incey Winsey Spider and Jack and Jill (1765).
