

#### **BOOK REVIEW - THE PORCELAIN MAKER BY SARAH FREETHY**

I enjoy historical fiction, and *The Porcelain Maker* blends fact and imagination beautifully. The story begins when Clara, an Englishwoman, travels to America to buy a set of delicate porcelain figurines at auction – a Viking, a shepherdess, a candelabra, a bear, a swallow, a greyhound, and a stallion. She believes the Viking could lead her to the father she has never known.

The novel shifts between present day and Weimar Germany, 1925 and traces the lives behind the figurines, intertwining love, loss, and survival with the chilling history of forced labour at Dachau, where prisoners created exquisite works of porcelain to stay alive. It's a moving, well-researched story that lingers long after the final page. Di Cross.

#### **BOOKCLUB CORNER**



Our new book this month is a memoir, *Ursula's Story*, by Vivien Wilson. Born in Berlin in 1913, with a Jewish father, Ursula is a naive but beautiful young art student and part-time fashion model. She finds herself only feet away from Hitler when she is working as an interpreter for the 1936 Olympics. She flees the Nazis and eventually travels to England where she shares a room with a snake charmer whilst working for a circus.

Armed with charm and a steely determination, she proposes to the first Englishman she meets. After a brief romance they are married but, in order to save her family, she forms a friendship with a prominent Jewish MP.

And how does she come to end her days in Sydney's Northern Beaches...you'll just have to read the story to find out.

#### **CRAFTY YARNERS**


Don't forget to come along to the Crafty Yarners on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month, 2 pm at the Newport Bowling Club.




