## **BILGOLA PLATEAU PROBUS CLUB PROFILE: MEET RAY DRURY**



Ray joined the Club at its formal meeting, making him one of our foundation members. Ray lost his beautiful wife in 2020 after 53 years of happy marriage, and although he manages well, he says it can feel lonely at times. Joining the Club was a way to stay connected and meet new people. He has made some good friends through the Club - though perhaps not as many as he'd hoped - possibly because there are fewer men than women, and the women tend to stay in their established groups.

Ray describes himself as a little introverted and shy. Even so, anyone who watched him dancing rock'n'roll at our last meeting would agree he certainly knows how to enjoy himself. Ray joins Club outings that look interesting to him, as long as his good friend Barbara, who he originally met at Pilates, and who is also a Club member, organises his bookings.

Ray grew up in the Canterbury-Bankstown area and, along with his father, became a passionate Bulldogs supporter. The team began in 1935 and won the premiership in 1938 - the year Ray was born - a coincidence that makes him love them even more. He now shares that passion with his son and son-in-law.

Ray left school at 16 and began work as an office boy earning five pounds a week. In 1954 he was encouraged to apply for a position at the Maritime Services Board and his application was successful. When he started with MSB, it was then located in a beautiful sandstone building at Circular Quay. That building now houses The Museum of Contemporary Art.

From the second floor, Ray had a clear view of the Sydney Opera House being built. He watched the land reclamation of Bennelong Point followed by the rise of the Opera House itself, and in 1960 he witnessed the first person ever to sing at the site — American activist Paul Robeson, who performed "Ol' Man River" for the construction workers. After forty years with the Maritime Services Board, Ray semi-retired and continued working until around 2003 in various casual positions, including with *Pittwater Life* magazine.

Ray's path to the Northern Beaches came about in an unexpected way. In the mid-60s he became engaged to a young woman who lived in Newport, and he decided to buy a block of land at Bilgola Plateau. Although the engagement ended, the land remained part of his life. In 1967 he married his wonderful wife Joy, and together they built a project home on the block, and raised their family there. Ray still lives in that home today, and he has a unique approach to house-work. He chuckles as he tells me he simply wanders around barefoot on the cork floors and sweeps up "when it feels a bit gritty."

Ray played golf (very badly he says) at Avalon and Palm Beach, but gave up when his partners either died or retired due to ill health. In his mid-60s, Ray took up Pilates, and it has been part of his routine ever since. He credits it with his ongoing good health and flexibility — no hip or knee replacements for him. Looking back, Ray considers himself blessed: a happy childhood, enjoyable school years, a wonderful marriage, and cherished children and friends.

These days Ray remains fit and active. He attends Pilates twice a week, as well as an occasional exercise class and looks forward to Friday nights when he watches the Friday night football with his son. With his Pilates classes, love of footy, book club, gardening, and the occasional surprise appearance on the dance floor, Ray is a valued and lively member of our Club.

An innovative range of 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary merchandise will also be produced along with a special pre-paid envelope produced by Australia Post and a special bottling of a fine French inspired luxury sparkling wine with an exclusive Probus 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary label.

The PSPL Board has enthusiastically supported the formation of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Organising Committee. Participants include all State & Territory Representative Directors with our primary goal to contribute, guide and organise an inclusive program of festivities for this milestone anniversary.




