Steve Jones took centre stage with his presentation of his read " Childhood's End" by Arthur C Clarke. This is a famous science fiction novel. published in 1953. The story begins with the sudden arrival of mysterious alien ships hovering over Earth's major cities. These beings, known as Overlords. impose benevolent but authoritarian rule. However, the Overlords remain unseen for decades, and when they finally reveal themselves, their appearances are startling: they resemble depictions traditional demons. The novel then shifts focus to the transcendence of humanity as children begin to develop psvchic abilities. signalling dramatic а evolutionary leap. The cost? The end of human individuality and culture as we know it.



Diane Tsoa-Lee wrote about her choice – "<u>A Love song for Ricki Wilde"</u>. If you are into rom-com movies, then this book is for you. A little of everything – love story, family disputes, racial problems over the decades, New York jazz scene of the 1920's and add to that a little time travel. It will not solve the world's problems; it is just a feel-good book that goes with the flow.



Di Cross likes historic fiction and chose a book called "The Women" by Kristin Hannah. This is the story of fictitious USA female nurses who volunteer to go to Vietnam during the War. They were young and naïve but determined to make a difference. The main character. Frankie McGrath, is raised on California's Coronado Island, leading a very conservative and sheltered life. Her brother joins up and under a saying she was once told" Women can be heroes". Frankie follows her brother. The process to volunteer is difficult and not encouraged by all departments, who followed the concept, - no women should go to war. She is exposed to the worst of humanity as well as participating in gory but lifesaving operations. Frankie also learns the value of true female friendship and the heartbreak that loves can cause. The worst aspect was coming home to a hostile America, where large sections of the population were fighting to stop the War and those that went, were spat upon and verbally abused. How this group of women survive is the centre of this emotional read.

The group talked about four books they read this month:

A Love song for Ricki Wilde; The Thursday Murder Club; Childhood's End, and The Women.

read "The Thursday Murder Club" by Richard Osman. In this story, four elderly residents in a retirement village have an interest in solving murders. They meet each Thursday over a glass of wine in the Jigsaw room. Then an actual murder takes place right on their doorstep. Each member of the group contributes a different aspect to solving the murder. It is told in a delightful and amusing read. This could be pertaining to the dialogue or the situation the group finds themselves in. You will not be able to resist a smile or laugh.

Book Club News

Our 10 members meet at Mona Vale Golf Club for a friendly hour every 5 weeks when we discuss the book we read in the previous month and preview the next one. Members take it in turns to select a title from the extensive book club kits provided by the Council's libraries, and bring the kit to the meeting. Each kit contains 10 books plus a laminated sheet which summarises the book and lists a set of questions which can be used if required to stimulate discussion. Kits cover a wide genre within fiction and non-fiction.

The book discussed at our last meeting "Ursula's Story": From Berlin to Bayview" didn't need the suggested questions. The author, Vivien Wilson, who lives locally, self-published the book which was, in her words, historical fiction. Ursula was the author's mother and what a life Ursula led. Born in 1913 in Berlin to a Jewish father and Protestant mother, growing up with Hitler's rise to power in the background, she wangled a visa to visit England in the late 1930's. Living in London she proposed to and married an Englishman shortly after they met, managed to get visas for her parents and sister, survived the blitz, had two daughters who emigrated to Australia, and after the death of her husband of 40 years, she came to Australia also. Ursula settled into a happy life in a retirement village in Bayview, hence the title.


It was difficult to separate fact from fiction and it left us asking some questions. Who was Frankie who popped up at the end of the book? Did the husband die here or in England? An editor may have tied up these and other loose endings but it was agreed Ursula had an amazing life and if only half was based on fact it was indeed amazing. It gave us a vivid picture of how difficult life could be in those times, how resilient Ursula was, and how her ties to family survived. Some enjoyed the book, some were unsure about it, but it promoted lots of lively discussion which is what it's all about.

Next month's book is "Jack Charles, Born-again Blakfella". This memoir shows Jack among other things as an actor, cat burglar, musician, heroin addict, activist, and an Aboriginal Elder. Stolen from his mother and placed into institutional care when only a few months old, the loneliness and isolation he experienced had a devastating impact that endured long after he reconnected with his Aboriginal roots. He still feels today an outsider, a loner, a fringe dweller.


