

Meetings: are held on 1st Friday of each month

Current Venue – The Fiddler

Windsor Road & Commercial Rd. Rouse Hill (entrance Commercial Rd) Greenway Room (please use rear car park Hotel end of complex)

Time – 10.00 (arrive from 9.15) until 12.00

Cost – Meeting is \$12.50 charge. All attendees are required to pay.

Lunch – Optional 12.00 – 2.00 in the Greenway Room

Menu – 2 for 1 deal on Mains, Burgers, Steak, Leafy & Light, Pizzas

Meeting RSVP: The Membership Officer will send out Reminder Notice of Monthly Meeting approximately 15 days before the meeting. The Fiddler requires numbers no later than 10 days prior to the meeting therefore members must respond by the date provided on the Reminder Notice. Members are requested to let the Membership Officer know – YES or No about your attendance at the meeting, and Yes or No to attending for lunch.

Attendance: Membership requires your attendance of no **fewer than fifty percent (50%) of regular meetings** in any club year. If you are unable to attend the meeting, then an apology should be sent to the Membership Officer by email or phone.

On arrival - Report to the Membership Officer at the entrance table. Your attendance will be recorded. Please mention if you intend to leave early, this is particularly important if we have to evacuate the room. If you have not paid your meeting fee prior to meeting, please proceed to Treasurer's table to pay, remembering to have your money in an envelope marked with Name, Date , Meeting Fee and Amount. Receipts will not be issued for this payment.

Wear your Probus Badge: This enables other members to get to know you at meetings and events.

Rostered Duties: You may be asked to help on the Registration Desk from time to time.

Meeting – The Meeting Room is set up with 10-12 tables of 10, Morning Tea is placed on each table with 3 coffee/tea stations around the room. Activity/Interest group information is available at the easterly end of the meeting room. This information can be accessed prior to the meeting and at Morning Tea break.

Members are requested to refrain from talking while reports are being given and during Speaker Presentations.

Activities – Payments & Sharing: You can sign up for numerous activities organised by the club. Some of these require prepayment. If you have expressed an interest in an activity, please keep a record of the date and time of the activity. If you then decide you cannot attend, **it is imperative** that you let the activity leader know as soon as possible. There may be others on the waiting list who will then be contacted. If you have signed up, (other than signing for an 'expression of interest') then you are committed for the payment. No refunds will be issued after payment is made unless there is a cancellation of the activity. If you have arranged to share accommodation with another member on an overnight activity, then this a personal agreement between you and that person – the club has no responsibility if your 'share' withdraws. You will be responsible for sorting out the payment due between yourselves or for paying the single supplement. Car-pooling arrangements are also your own responsibility. Participation in activities is encouraged.

Leave of Absence: Leave of absence can be applied for in writing to the Secretary, in cases of sickness, extended travel or other reasonable grounds.

Resignation: A member may resign by giving written notice of resignation to the Secretary

Unless otherwise negotiated with the BHPC Committee, non-payment of annual membership renewals fees and submission of Application for Renewal of Membership Form by 31 March, will indicate that a person no longer wishes to continue their membership.

Update Personal Details: Inform the Membership Officer if your details change – your address, phone, email address and emergency contact name and phone number. These details will be kept in a secure place by the Membership Officer and never made available to any body other than the Committee, unless express permission is given by the Member.

Keep Yourself Informed: Use the website and newsletters to find the current Meeting venue arrangements as well as when, how and due dates of payments for activities.

Visitors: Your friends are welcome to visit the meetings and/or attend activities with you but the number of non-member visits is restricted to three (3) per individual per membership year.

Welfare: If you are or if you know of any of member who is ill, recovering from an accident, or would like a cheerio call or a helping hand please contact our Welfare Officer or a Committee Member. Please be assured that privacy will always be respected.

Members with Illness or Disabilities: If you are participating in meetings or outings, please ensure that you are fit and well enough to attend. Some club members may suffer disabilities which restrict their ability to move around and to travel and participate in meetings and outings of the Club. Given the age and health profiles of members in general and possible insurance concerns, it may not be possible to provide support needed by disabled members from within club membership. The Management Committee of the Club will require any applicant/s who may suffer a disability to guarantee they are able to provide their own carer/s to assist with transport and mobility during meetings and outings of our Club. Such carer/s need not join the Club; however the Club is not responsible for any financial outlay incurred by the carer/s during meetings and outings of our Club.

Evacuation Procedures— Any member or visitor must be aware of the evacuation exits and if any emergency occurs follow instructions from The Fiddler staff.

It is important that members and visitors "register" when attending meetings. If you leave the meeting early it is equally important to notify our Membership Officer or a Committee member who will have you "signed out". We will use the Attendance sheet for a "roll call" to ensure all attending members are accounted for.

We ask that, if safe to do so, our more able-bodied members assist others not so mobile in any emergency.
