

## GUEST SPEAKER AUTHOR, PETER KENNEDY



**Peter Kennedy** was our return guest speaker in July. He briefly recapped on early premiers he had known and continued his discussion.

<u>David Brand (1959–1971)</u> developed a "let's have a chat" style of leadership. He acted as the "glue that held government together", as not all members were team players. He tried to charge up the economy but there was an iron ore export embargo.

<u>John Tonkin (1971–1974)</u> taught in Kalgoorlie and in the south-west until 1933 when he entered parliament. He had served as Education and Works Minister. He initiated the Kwinana freeway and Narrows Bridge, looked after people who needed a hand but made no major changes.

<u>Charlie (Sir Charles) Court, (1974–82)</u> "my way or the highway" style made things happen. Under his premiership Oil and Gas developments began on the North-West shelf, Dampier to Bunbury Gas Pipeline and expanded iron ore mining.

Mistakes – the Fremantle/Perth railway closure and tough industrial legislation.

He was the only Premier born outside of Australia.

<u>Ray O'Connor (1982–83)</u> was a sporty, ex-East Perth WAFL player, business person, well liked but trouble followed him. He was subsequently gaoled following a Royal Commission into WA Inc.

<u>Brian Burke (1983–1989)</u> came from a political family. Smart politically, he was only 36 years old. In 1983, when Alan Bond won the America's Cup, the economy was flourishing. The Bond relationship had many implications for the Premier and made it hard to refuse requests from business interests. His close relationships were with people like Laurie Connell, Alan Bond, Josie Goldberg and Dallas Dempster. Dempster claimed a casino would be preferable to illegal gambling in Northbridge and that gambling tax would bring money to the state's coffers.

Burke reopened the Fremantle-Perth railway.

He was gaoled in the subsequent Royal Commission into W.A. Inc

<u>Peter Dowding (1988–1990)</u> inherited the Burke-lead Rothwell's rescue following the stock market collapse in 1987. The initial capital injection of \$20m wasn't sufficient and eventually more money was requested.

<u>Carmen Lawrence (1990–1992)</u>, Australia's first woman Premier, started a new wave — currently there are more women than men in the Legislative Assembly. Money became an issue and she bowed to pressure to hold a Royal Commission into WA Inc.

In the 1993 election she was dragged into the "Penny Easton Affair". Family Court matters are off limits to politicians.

**Richard Court (1993–2001)** won the next election. He was nothing like his Dad, according to his Mum who considered him the least likely of all sons to succeed in politics as "he saw good in everyone". He quickly learnt the ropes and was not a pushover. He restored WA's reputation in doing business. Major legacies - Narrows Bridge duplicated, Windan Bridge built, Northbridge Tunnel constructed and also the "Bell Tower". He was accused by National's leader Hendy Cowan of being "city centric". Served two terms as premier.

<u>Geoff Gallop (2001–2006)</u> was young, smart and promoted WA well with energy and courage. Controversially, he had children (largely Aboriginal), who roamed the late night streets of Northbridge unsupervised, taken into a safe place. When accused of racism, he maintained it was the safety of the children, irrespective of colour.

A year later, he stepped down, due to mental health reasons. Major legacies are the railway to Mandurah, as well as the first of W.A.'s de-salination plants.

<u>Alan Carpenter (2006–2008)</u> a former ABC colleague of Peter's, took over the helm. He was well liked. Some ministers in his cabinet were implicated in a Crime Corruption Commission, including one who had driven without a license, while others had a hotline to Brian Burke despite contrary instructions.

<u>Colin Barnett (2008–2017)</u> became leader following Troy Buswell's resignation. He was good for the State, being experienced. His major achievements included the underground airport railway and oil and gas expansion, Elizabeth Quay and the Perth stadium. His plans for Oakajee Port near Geraldton didn't happen. He led government for 8 years but during his second term had to sell off assets as iron ore prices fell.

<u>Mark McGowan (2017–2023)</u> was born in northern NSW where his parents ran a squash centre. He studied law in Brisbane and came to Garden Island as a naval lawyer. He stood for local government in 1996.

Interviewed by Peter two months after becoming Premier he told Peter "I don't feel any different", to which Peter responded prophetically "when something to lead comes up, you will feel different". This happened to be Covid. Mark's leadership protected WA giving him a with a 90 percent approval rating. He decided he'd had enough and resigned in 2023.

At the end of his delivery, Peter once again sold and signed copies of his book, "Tales from Boomtown"
