# GUEST SPEAKER FOR SEPTEMBER RON BANKS AUTHOR AND FORMER ARTS EDITOR

Our September speaker, Ron Banks, was arts editor with the *West Australian*, prior to his retirement. He has since written a memoir, *Other Times*, based on his experiences of life in Perth in the 1950's and as a journalist.

He reminded us this was before digital media was the norm and the four pence in the slot, telephone boxes were replaced by smart phones.

Club members recalled their experiences during his talk—and a picture of life in Perth during the 1950's and 1960's emerged.

While Perth was full of mainly "Brits", the post-war boom also included D.P.'s from eastern Europe, and immigrants from Holland, Italy, and elsewhere, which changed demographics. "Ten Pound Poms" and later, sponsored workers, increased the population.

Ron grew up in Mosman Park, then full of factory workers, lumpers and other manual labourers. Members who had arrived from overseas as children, recalled places like Noalimba, Graylands, Wexcombe, Belmont, Pinjarra and outer hills settlements as their initial homes.

There were weekly deliveries of blocks of ice for Coolgardie safes and other coolers,

Milkman delivered milk in bottles; one member remembered milk being delivered weekly, in urns! Bakers' delivered bread (unsliced), Chinese grocers delivered fruit and vegetables, store owners delivered groceries. One member recalled a "to the fridge" delivery to his home, as no-one locked their doors!

Indigenous men sold washing line props. Washing was done in coppers, and Reckitt's blue was a well-known clothing brightener.

Outdoor loos (dunnies) complete with newsprint as toilet paper, redback spiders and lane ways were also recalled — but not with fondness.

Society was largely patriarchal with stay-at-home mums and the expectation that boys would complete further studies, while girls would become typists/secretaries. Female teachers were expected to quit their position on marriage. Some members, however, reminded us that this was not the case in the UK where equal opportunities existed for all school children.

In the 1950's, religious instruction was taught in schools and there was a Protestant/Catholic divide. It was also the time of the Billy Graham Crusades. Evangelism still occurs today, recalled one member.

The 1960's were a period of change. In 1964, according to Ron, "Perth lost its innocence" as the serial murderer Eric Edgar Cooke roamed the suburbs. Then people kept their doors firmly locked!

In conclusion, Ron said that "Memories soften, over time" and we tend to forget the hardships.

Perth has certainly come a long way.


Usually members make their own way to the venue but if you are interested in car pooling, please let me know.


