GUEST SPEAKER



By all reports, our June Guest Paul Kearney was very well received, with lots of smiles and foot-tapping accompaniment from the audience.

Our guest speaker for July is Steve Liebmann whose biography follows:

Steve Liebmann – “The Ramblings of an Ageing Broadcaster”



Steve began his broadcasting career at Radio 2XL in his home town of Cooma NSW while still attending high school. On leaving school he joined 2XL full time until moving to Canberra in 1962 where he joined Radio 2CA and became involved in journalism.

Steve had his first taste of television when he took up a position with Channel 7 as News Editor and on-air presenter in 1967. In 1968 Steve moved to Radio 2UE Sydney as a senior journalist and progressed to Director of News and Public Affairs. Steve then became news presenter and commentator at Radio 2SM Sydney, host of Channel 7's Eleven AM and anchorman for Channel 7's Sydney News. He also hosted the Willesee programme several times as well as writing articles for The Bulletin and Men In Vogue and a number of newspaper columns.

In 1981 Steve joined the Nine Network as the original co-host of the Today show. After five years with the programme, he moved to Channel 10 Sydney to present the main evening news bulletin. Steve returned to the Nine Network in 1990 to again co-host the Today show, stepping down in 2005 to pursue other media interests. In 2010, he hosted the morning program on Sydney radio station 2UE and in 2011, took a break from radio to concentrate on corporate MC and hosting opportunities. Steve's awards include News Presenter of the Year from the Australian Commercial Radio Industry and the Penguin Award for Special Recognition for Contribution to News.

I am now experiencing problems with members putting their names on the list just because they can and having these members who are not committed to going on these tours cancel which then creates huge problems. I have members adding their name and also the names of other members they think may want to go on these tours to the appropriate interest list. I then use these numbers which I forward to the tour company for them to arrange suitable accommodation at the various venues.

One of the problems I have is that there are groups who put their names down with other members they think may go on the tour and if one cancels they all cancel. I also have individual members who also cancel for no reason.

This makes it very difficult for me as well as the tour companies to make the proper arrangements. I fully understand there are times when you need to cancel for personal reasons but that is not the problem I am talking about.

Just to name one example, I had the Mudgee tour arranged with the tour company in conjunction with another Probus club. I initially had 22 names on the interest list and St Ives Probus were going to make the numbers up for the tour. I then had cancellation after cancellation, and I ended up with only 5 names on the list with 1 confirmed. I then had to go back to the tour company and cancel the tour.

Over the years I have had a very good relationship with tour companies, and I personally find it difficult to go back to these companies and cancel the tour.

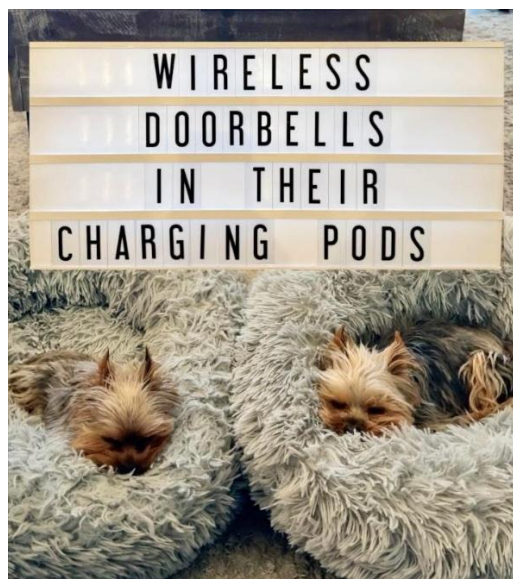

CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF MAVIS



Mavis was born in Kogarah, NSW in 1925. the youngest of five children. After completing her matriculation at 16, duxing the state in Biology. Mavis went on to Teachers College where she majored in Home Economics. Mavis was passionate about sharing this love with others and continues to have a strong interest in all things food.

Graduating from Teachers College in 1944 and having taught at several Sydney metropolitan schools. Mavis was promoted to Acting Mistress of Subject in 1956 and Full Mistress in 1966. Mavis continued teaching until 1980 - an amazing 36 year career.

Too young to fully retire, at 55 years, Mavis was appointed the first Volunteer Co-Ordinator at the (then) Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children in Camperdown, NSW.



Upon moving to Adelaide, SA in 1981, Mavis launched 'The Volunteer Centre of South Australia', utilising her leadership, communication and negotiation skills in another direction. In 1984, the Volunteer Centre opened two branches in the Adelaide area. Even though Mavis had returned to NSW by then. By 1986 The Volunteer Centre grew and had registered 2,000 volunteers contributing to various areas of the community, often through corporate employer programs.

On her return to NSW, Mavis continued to be involved in volunteering, launching the Volunteer Centre of Penrith in 1985 and the Penrith Disability Resource Centre in 1988.

Mavis spear-headed the creation of the Foundation for Creative Enterprise, Inc. which supported the creative arts in the Nepean area of Sydney, including the Creative Embroiderers of the Penrith Valley. At least five stunning embroideries were produced and now hang in Penrith Council buildings. Mavis was actively involved in The Foundation until 2007 (at 82 years of age) when she decided to fully retire, and the Foundation was dissolved. The records are now kept in the social history section of Penrith Library.



In June 2002, her efforts were recognised with Mavis receiving an Order of Australia Medal for services to the Community, Creative Arts projects and volunteer groups. Throughout all this, Mavis enjoyed travelling overseas many times, often solo and always with a view to learning and experiencing new adventures.

Mavis' moved into Courtlands independent living in 2009 where she was involved in many activities onsite as well as Probus, where she is a founding member. Now in The Grange, she continues to maintain friendships and interests in the Courtlands community.

Mavis has always had a focus on contributing to the community, be it through education or community enterprise. She is a great role model to her family and the many students and people she has influenced along the way.
