

ANZAC Memorial Tour and Lunch



The Anzac Memorial was opened in 1934 thanks to funds raised by the people of New South Wales. It is both a work of art and a remarkable piece of architecture but most importantly a permanent edifice and tribute to the memory of all the members of the Australian Imperial Forces (as they were then known) who lost their lives, either directly or indirectly as a result of the Great War.

Built in 1868, the **Paragon Hotel** is still at Circular Quay. Recently restored to its former glory, the Paragon celebrates the essence of Sydney's contemporary pub culture.

The day combines a guided tour of the **ANZAC Memorial** with lunch at the **Paragon Hotel**. The tour lasts until 12.30 pm. We will then travel to the **Paragon** for lunch around 1.00 pm.

WHEN: 28th May 2025 at 10.45 am.

WHERE: Meet upstairs in the Hall of Memory at the **ANZAC Memorial**, Hyde Park.

TRAVEL:

- Alight at Museum Train Station in time for the 10.45 am start.
- At the conclusion of the tour we will catch a train to Circular Quay Train Station, then cross Alfred Street (ie the tramway) to the **Paragon Hotel**.
- At the end of lunch catch the train home.
