Our guest speaker was **Bill Ireland**, a lifelong resident of Boronia. He shared fascinating insights into Boronia's early days, noting that the area was officially named in **1915**. Among the interesting facts he mentioned: the first shop was a general store, the post office opened in **1920**, and by **1923**, Boronia had its first school.

Bill began his schooling in Boronia in **1950**, and later in **1954**, when Ferntree Gully North Primary School opened, he was among its first students.

To complement his talk, Bill presented a wonderful slideshow featuring historic images of the area, each accompanied by captivating stories from Boronia's past.

- Did you know when lightning strikes it can reach up to 30,000 degrees celsius (54,000 degrees Fahrenheit)


