Teeny again inspired us with her vision for Burnie and the municipality. We were shown a video she compiled indicating the various projects and works which are being constructed at this time.

Some of these were:

- (a) The South Burnie Boat Ramp
- (b)Redevelopment of the Burnie Arts Centre & Plaza
- (c)Burnie Coastal Pathway
- (d)The Marinus Link-which will create many Jobs
- (e) A Bio Company, South of Burnie
- (f)Focusing on reinvigorating the Burnie CBD

It was a very inspiring presentation and she talked further in turning Burnie around for a brighter future. Teeny has a plan for Burnie and addressed it with a lot of passion to achieve this. She spoke with such enthusiasm which I found infectious and wish her well in her endeavours!



Bruce spoke of his time whilst operating a Hardware Store there for 65 years (with his brother) and the many other businesses and the characters who ran them.

The name Cooee came about perhaps because its location, just outside of Burnie, is a *Cooee* or a shout away.

In its heyday it was always referred to as The Golden Mile with no fewer than 5 Service Stations and many Used and New Car Yards.

It also had its own Post Office which was opened in 1906.

Bruce came into contact with many characters and businesses some of which were Cooee Brickworks, and Lloyd Bonney who operated a Service Station, a quarry, raised horses and owned a number of farms. At his peak he employed some 148 people.

Other Businesses were a Cordial Factory, an Abattoir and Sale yards, Collins Bakery, Bass Bakery, TAS Sea roads, two Milk Bars and many more.

Bruce's family was involved in the building industry and had a strong association with the council. He was instrumental in the creating the Les Clark Oval which still caters for many community events to this day.

Thank you Bruce for sharing your memories of Cooee or the Golden Mile. I am sure many of our members can relate to the many characters you mentioned. *Gradus*.
