September Meeting



First item of business was the induction of three new members, Les Naunton, Kerry Broad and John Simpson. Welcome aboard Gentlemen!!

Birthdays this month were celebrated by Peter Brumby, Peter Holloway and Ant Dry.

Club speaker John Lamb presented some incidental aspects of Burnie's history, with a focus on Wilmot Street. A century-old postcard photograph of the street featuring Charles Broad, grandfather of club members Ian and Kerry, sparked keen interest, giving rise to numerous stories of the past.

Guest Speaker Ken Drake, Community Engagement Officer for Marinus Link presented an enthusiastic picture of the proposed future for the project. He explained that Marinus will be an interconnector, enabling Tasmania and Victoria to trade power. This will give us access to the cheapest power at any given time. It will enable Victoria to keep their lights on using our hydro power. The project is estimated to cost 3.89 billion dollars, with the promise of reducing power prices by \$113 per household per year. It is planned to exploit power from wind farms at St Patrick's Plains,

Whaleback Ridge and Robbins Island, all of which, Ken says, are looking optimistic. Approval for the project is yet to be granted by the Australian Energy Regulator. While an Italian company will supply, lay, and connect the cables using Italian labour, it is expected that local business and labour will be involved in the building work at Heybridge. Peter Ansell expressed our appreciation to Ken, who concluded by drawing the raffle.
